2. "your salvation"

Paul afflicted to establish and nuture Corinthian church 11:28 constant concern for the church

3. "your growth"

"which is effective in the patient enduring"
Paul encouraged even more w/ church endures
"endurance" Job (Js 5:10-11)

it took the risk of death to do this ministry hardships include opposition

vs 9

"not trust in ourselves"
this affliction to teach us trust
"in God Who raises the dead" remember Abraham?

vs 10

"Who delivered us and will deliver us"

He did it once and He will do it again repeats at end of verse yet more affliction to be expected "on Whom we have set our hope" i.e. our eyes were not on life but on Him

vs 11

"helping us through your prayers"
you were a part of our deliverance
God delivered us through your prayers
